

Thoughts for the month



March.

A month that heralds the start of spring and the equinox on the 20th usually bringing unsettled weather. Not something new as the early 19th century poet John Clare wrote, *'March month of "many weathers"* (after the storms and floods of January I hope that prediction is not correct!)

But it is not just the weather that is very unsettled, we also live in unsettled times politically, economically, and socially, both in this country and globally. How can we make sense of young people still at school killing another young person because they do not like them? Rampant knife crime? Burglary in houses around us in the Colnes? The brutality of war and its human consequences? I could write an unsettlingly lengthy list.

But life goes on and as we travel through March perhaps a few thoughts may help our journey.

March is a busy month for the church, it is an early Easter this year with Easter Day on March 31st (incidentally the same day as we change the clocks). We each walk our own

path through life, it is unique, no one else walks exactly the way we do, and this uniqueness can bring both joy and sadness. Perhaps a day will remind us of a happy occasion, a birthday, or a family event or a sad day, the birthday of a departed relative or friend.



Correspondence



ROUGH WINDS

Fortunately, our corner of the country seems to have suffered less from the series of recent gales than some areas further north. At least this winter's storms were predicted, unlike the so-called hurricane of 1987 which took everyone by surprise (including the forecaster Michael Fish). It was claimed at the time to have been the worst weather event for three hundred years and, surprisingly, local evidence helps to support that claim. On 18 February 1662 the then Vicar of Earls Colne, the Reverend Ralph Josselin, wrote in his diary:

"Trees blown down within the Priory wall. Timber rent up in high standing woods. The wind general in England and Holland sea coast but not in Scotland."

A section of the Priory boundary wall in Lower Holt Street still bears the scars and the initials "RH" for Richard Harlackenden, the owner of the Priory who carried out the repairs to the damage. Later in his diary Ralph Josselin muses:

"The season somewhat more winterly than formerly. I observe how apt we are to account a harsh time the hardest we ever felt and a mild the best, letting slip out of our mind what was formerly."

That trick of the memory is still sometimes evident today.

Crime Prevention



Spring Garden Crime Prevention (Part 1)

Now is a good time to look around your garden; are your fences and gates in good condition, do you have good quality locks on gates, will they keep the unwelcome intruder out? To the front of your property where possible keep fencing, planting, and hedges to about 1.2m in height so that an intruder is not hidden from view. Protect your rear garden with 1.8m strong fencing, close boarded wooden fencing and gates are a good choice and this can be topped with trellis or a plastic spiky topping such as <u>www.defendastrip.com</u> (warning signs needed). Panels should not be able to be lifted out of the posts and avoid your fencing becoming a ladder by ensuring that the horizontal cross battens are facing into your garden.

Defensive planting: Security does not have to be just about locks, bolts, and spiky fence toppings; nature provides some excellent plants to keep people away. There are several attractive, fragrant plants of a spiky nature such as climbing roses, pyracantha, berberis of a dense nature that work quite well. Have a chat at your garden centre or with the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) for the right plant for the right location. garden demonstrating how plants and good garden design help protect your home. <u>Working in the garden</u>: It is easy to get engrossed in what you are doing when working in the garden, if the house is empty, close and lock the door (don't forget the key though!). Remember at the end of the day, as well as putting tools away put the wheelbarrow and wheelie bin away too. "It will add insult to injury" if your tools are used to break into your house, a neighbour's, nearby building such as a church, or provide a climbing aid or method of carrying things away. If you are not using your lawn mower, jet washer or other put it away out of sight from prying eyes.

<u>Property marking:</u> It may deter a thief if your property or flower pots are visibly security marked with your house number and post code or labelled if a forensic (hidden) property marking system is used such as <u>www.smartwater.com</u>, <u>www.selectadna.co.uk</u> or <u>www.datatag.co.uk</u>. You can also record the serial numbers of any tools at <u>www.immobilise.com</u>. If your property does get stolen with property marking and/or recording, there is a greater chance of you getting it back.

A little bit of Hollywood in the rain forest.

In 2021 a discovery was made in the Ebo forest in Cameroon. A critically endangered species of a tropical tree was found growing there, numbering less than 50 mature plants, *Uvariopsis dicaprio*, (there is a clue in the name). It has a 'stay of execution' due to the efforts of amongst others, Hollywood star Leonardo DiCaprio. The Forest was earmarked to be opened for logging which would mean devastation for the rare flora and fauna that live in the rich biodiversity of the forest. A campaign led by Mr DiCaprio with the aid of millions of his followers on social media raising awareness of the plight of the forest, resulted in the Government backing down on their decision. Mr DiCaprio along with Jeff Bezos, founder of the delivery service Amazon have been working together to raise awareness to slow down and stop deforestation; donating millions of dollars to various conservation projects worldwide, particularly in Brazil where the aim is to reduce the cutting down of the rainforest to zero within the next three to four years. Environmental factors (dare I suggest climate change) and 'slash and burn' methods of forest clearance has had a major impact on plants and wildlife in the tropical forests of the world. Scientists at The Royal Botanic Gardens Kew honoured

In other news, back at home, lets talk lilies, March is the last chance to plant lilies for summer flowering, if you don't want to do that, wait till the garden centres are selling them in full bloom, this way you can pick the colours you like, pop them in the ground and enjoy them year after year. Alternatively, buy some bulbs, plant them 6" (150mm) deep in the border where you want them to flower and you will see them popping up amongst whatever else is growing in early to late summer, and you probably will have three times as many for the same price, it just takes a little planning and forethought. When I say where you want them to flower, they prefer full sun or partialCont'd /

shade, and avoid boggy soil, to have the best chance of success, I would go for Asiatic Lilies, these cope well in our climate. If you want to wait and see what they look and grow like, put them in pots then either plant them in full flower, or hide them in the pots amongst the planting in your border, I won't tell if you don't. Just one word of caution, keep an eye out for Aphids (disease spreaders) and red beetles (the no 1 criminal) lily beetle, if you have the stomach for it crush them on sight, but good luck with that, if they see you coming they drop to the ground and you will never find them, (they are the S.A.S. of beetles) although I hate to say it, the thing I have found most effective is 'Provado' bug killer, spray the plants every 10 days as soon as you see a beetle, this interrupts the life cycle of the bugs and hopefully one day you will be lily beetle free. If you want to be more adventurous, go for the giant lilies advertised in plant catalogues, they do look good, but put them at the back of the border and be prepared to stake them. If you haven't already done so, there is still pruning that can be done now, first thing, (you should know the rules by now) the three D's, dead, diseased and dying, if it is flowering or likely to in the next month, don't touch it, don't get me wrong, if you need to, prune away, but if you do you will be losing flowers, but nobody will die. I don't mention Grasses much, deciduous grasses can be cut down

Gardening (Cont'd)



hard, it's easy to tell which ones these are, they look dead, when pruning down you may even see the new green shoots appearing at the base. Evergreens on the other hand are still green (unless they are dead) these are best left to late Spring when they just need the dead thatch combing out to tidy them up (if they are dead, they will come up in your hand). *Buddleia* can be pruned down to within an inch of its life, and it will normally grow back with vigour, personally, I don't like to go lower than 18" (450mm) from the ground. *Hydrangeas* need the dead flower heads cut back to the first or second set of buds down the stem, if you know your *Hydrangeas* and you have H. paniculata, this can be pruned back harder to give a good shape.

Going Walk About



Our January walk was from Bulmer Tye, striking out in the direction of Belchamp Walter and returning through the main village of Bulmer. The group was nineteen strong and we had an eventful day, meeting up with a distraught couple who had lost their dog after it had chased after a herd of deer (they contacted us later to confirm they had found it); while a lost pair of sunglasses caused a delay, but hilarity when they were found!

I have not done much walking in this area and was so impressed with the scenery and views that for the longer walk, on the following Tuesday, we walked from the Belchamps towards Bulmer, another great walk embracing lots of real and fictional history. The area has links back to the De Vere dynasty, the impressive Belchamp Hall and park, the castle-like folly in the middle of a field, and the marvellous churches at Belchamp Otten and Belchamp Walter, while connoisseurs of Lovejoy will have recognised many of the buildings and landmarks.

Our February walk (24th) will be around Henny, starting from the Henny Swan and is about 4.7 miles long, following parts of the Stour Valley Way.

Up On The Allotment



On the plot

I am no eco warrior, but just by growing my own veg (or some of it at least) I am helping the climate. So, I know there is a war on plastic, but if, like me you have a mountain of plastic pots, they need to be re-used over and over, what else do we do? The black ones can't be recycled. If you have 6", 8", 10" pots or bigger (that's 150mm, 200mm, and 250mm in new money) why not plant things like lettuce, onions, garlic or any other shallow rooted veg you can think of and sink the pots in the ground, they act as instant spacing, they hold moisture longer in a drought and when its harvest time, just lift the whole pot as you need it. I know I harp on about water (in ten years we will be fighting in the streets for it) but I have containers of all shapes and sizes on every available space on my allotment, collecting the ample supplies of water dropping from the skies at the moment. When there is a lack of supply in the communal tank (which I must add comes from water pumped from the river), or when I don't want to make the trek across everyone else's plots to collect it, I have a ready available supply well within reach of all my plantings. Talking of plantings, what to do now? One thing I will try this year is crystal lemon cucumber, I grew it for a client last season, and she made me some chutney from it, it was delicious, it is drought tolerant and cold hardy, so what's not to like? If you want to risk it, first early potatoes can go out now, theCont'd /

traditional way, in the ground a couple of inches deep, or , if like me, you prefer to grow in tubs, a 2" (50mm) layer of compost on the bottom before placing seed spuds in and the same amount on the top, with fleece or some other insulating layer to improve the chances of success. Just a quick list of what can be sown outside in March, weather permitting: beetroot, carrots, cauliflowers, Jerusalem artichoke, parsnips, rocket and strawberries.



Recípe Corner



Crispy Seaweed One of the things about growing up is realising which is truth, and that which is fiction. Another is that Chinese crispy seaweed is not made from the slimy stuff you see clinging to breakwaters on the beach. It still tastes jolly good, though.

- **Ingredients**
- About 200g of kale 2 tablespoonsful of oil (any sort)
- A pinch of salt
- 2 tablespoonsful of brown sugar
- A teaspoonful of five spice powder.

Method

 First prepare the kale. With a sharp knife, cut out the stalk and the fibrous vein down the centre of each kale leaf and discard. Using the same knife, chop the leaves finely. Then, using a herb cutter, chop them even more finely, as small and as powdery as you can. But don't be tempted to deploy the blade or grater on the food processor, as the kale will clog up the machine.



2. Place the chopped kale into a mixing bowl. Add the oil, salt and five spice powder and stir them in.

If you're making an Asian meal, cook the 'seaweed' first.

 Place the kale into a wok (you don't need any more oil) and cook at high temperature. Stir vigorously.



- After a couple of minutes, lower the temperature and add the sugar. Carry on stirring vigorously. Don't let the kale burn (go black in the pan).
- Place the 'seaweed' in a serving dish and keep it in a warm oven while you're cooking the rest of your Asian meal. This makes it crisp

Brick Meadows

As we write this at the very end of January, nature is already showing its optimism with Snowdrops appearing and green shoots showing on some very sheltered Elder trees plus there has been a marked increase in birdsong. The meadows, with its diverse habitats are a wonderful area to witness nature and we encourage everyone to spend time in the area, make use of the benches and enjoy some tranquillity, even in the Winter!

With the prospect of cattle in the meadows now highly unlikely, the monthly work party put its January efforts into removing gate posts and kissing gate assemblies to open up the footpaths. These will be reused to replace the wooden gates and fencing on the boundaries which are now well past their best. An ongoing project is to remove the barbed wire, erected several years ago, to contain the cattle, before it becomes too entwined in the bushes or falls into the soil. With the wooden posts rotting this is becoming an increasingly urgent task.

Two Tawny Owl boxes have been placed in trees with one in the Long Meadow and one on the edge of the wood. As part of winter maintenance, and before birds start nesting, hedges have been cut which, we hope, will encourage nature to provide good hideaways for nest building.

It has been most encouraging to see the paths in the Poplars Field alongside Hawe Brook being well used. We hope that this will continue through the spring and summer, as continued use helps keep weeds down and makes maintenance easier.

Work has started on the annual cut of the anthills field and, hopefully, by the time this is read a "willing" work party will have been assembled to clear. Removing the cut undergrowth has an important role in reducing soil fertility. Fertility encourages brambles and coarse grasses to grow, and these overwhelm the wildflowers as they germinate and also shade the anthills which is undesirable.

The Meadows now have their own Facebook page (Earls Colne Brick Meadows) through which pictures of the seasonal changes, works being carried out and nature's hi-lights will be shown. Please log on, spread the word and like.

Work continues behind the scenes to get the three fields adjacent to Church Hill and Coggeshall Road added to the existing Nature Reserve status enjoyed by the Long Meadow, the Woods and the Anthills field and we hope the this will have a successful outcome in 2024 to get added protection for this village asset.
